

# Portuguese Studies (Minor)

The objective of the minor in a foreign language is to enable students majoring in any field to acquire proficiency in a second language, understanding of the culture, and knowledge of the countries in which the language is spoken.

## Admissions

To be admitted to the program, a student must have a GPA of at least 2.0. Application for admission to any University minor program is now available via MyPack Portal. Admission will be based upon the student's academic record, and in most cases no longer requires departmental review. To declare the Italian Minor, go to the Add a Minor (<https://studentservices.ncsu.edu/your-degree/coda-home/add-a-minor/>) page. (Students may declare the minor when they are enrolled in a class that counts toward the minor.)

## Certification

Paperwork for certification should be completed no later than during the registration period for the student's final semester at NC State. Students should meet with the Coordinator of Advising to complete with the final certification. Students will receive official recognition on their transcripts for the completed minor.

## Plan Requirements

- Completion of 15 credit hours is required.
- 9 Credit hours must be taken at NC State or through the UNC Language Assembly/Portuguese as World Language Consortium.
- In addition to FLP 201 Intermediate Portuguese I (3 credits), two additional Portuguese language or culture courses (6 credits) above the FLP 201 Intermediate Portuguese I level to be listed under the FL 295 Special Topics in Foreign Languages and/or Literatures rubric must be taken through the UNC Language Assembly/Portuguese as a World Language Consortium are required.

- A maximum of six (6) credit hours may be transferred into the minor from another institution. The minor adviser may approve more on a discretionary basis.
- The Department of Foreign Languages and Literature will determine which courses transferred from other institutions may qualify to meet requirements for the minor.
- A grade of 'C-' or better is required in all courses in the minor program.
- A maximum of **two** (2) courses may be used (double-counted) towards both another departmental major requirements and minor requirements.
