The minor in Social Work is designed to familiarize students with the social service system, major social welfare programs, and elements of the profession of social work. This is an excellent minor for students interested in combining a primary academic area (major), such as sociology, political science, or psychology with social welfare and professional social work content. It is also an excellent field of study for students majoring in any area who many need or desire knowledge of social welfare and social services. No courses for the minor may be taken for S/U credit.

Plan Requirements

- A total of 16 hours (5 courses) is required for the minor. Four required courses (13 credit hours) and one SW Elective (3 credit hours).
- A grade of 'C' or better must be achieved in each class counting toward the minor and an overall GPA of 2.5 must be maintained in the minor courses.
- All courses in the minor must be taken for a letter grade. Credit only is not permitted.
- A maximum of six credit hours may be transferred into the minor from another CSWE-accredited institution. The School of Social Work will determine which courses transferred from other institutions may qualify to meet requirements for the minor.
- A maximum of ONE (1) course may double-count between major departmental requirements and courses counting toward the minor.
- A maximum of ONE (1) course may double-count between courses counting toward this minor and additional minors.
