Major concentrations in Arabic Studies, Asian Language, French Language and Literatures, German Studies, Spanish Language and Literatures, and World Language Education with a Chinese, French, German, or Spanish option.

Outstanding students may become members of the Pi Delta Phi, French Honor Society, Sigma Delta Pi, National Hispanic Honor Society, or of Delta Phi Alpha, German Honor Society.
