All the general requirements for Bachelor of Arts degree must be met. Degree designations are B.A. in World Languages and Cultures. Major concentrations in Arabic Studies, Asian Language, French Language and Literatures, German Studies, Spanish Language and Literatures, and World Language Education with a Chinese, French, German, or Spanish option.

Outstanding students may become members of the Pi Delta Phi, French Honor Society, Sigma Delta Pi, National Hispanic Honor Society, or of Delta Phi Alpha, German Honor Society.

### Concentration in World Language Education with Chinese, French, German, or Spanish Teaching Option

In collaboration with the College of Education and the Department of Curriculum and Instruction, the Department of World Languages and Cultures offers a program leading to a Chinese, French, German, or Spanish teaching license in North Carolina, grades K-12.
