It is required that all German Studies students participate in at least one regular semester of study abroad or internship (3-4 months minimum) in a German-speaking country. Please note that no more than 15 hours of transfer credit (from study abroad or other US Institutions which are not a part of UNC-Online) may be applied towards core courses in German

Studies (core: required courses, departmental electives, FLG electives I and II, and advised electives I and II). FLG 499 Internship in Germany, Austria, or German-Speaking Switzerland is an internship course with up to 6 credits. For students who choose study abroad instead of an internship, FLG 499 Internship in Germany, Austria, or German-Speaking Switzerland serves as a placeholder for transfer credits from the study abroad semester.
