A four-semester program of study in German as a second language to allow undergraduate students to develop competence in and knowledge of the language; increased understanding and appreciation of German, Austrian, and Swiss cultures; and greater knowledge of the countries where German is spoken. This program is open to undergraduates in any major and of any class standing.

 A total of 12 semester hours is required; at least six credit hours must be taken at NC State. The remaining credit hours may be taken through affiliate programs (e.g. the UNC Language Exchange (https:// fll.chass.ncsu.edu/undergraduate/language_exchange.php) or an NC State Study Abroad program).
